Establishing a land school or land-based learning template for PCCN program, possibly through a 2 week <i>section</i> in POLI 1145/PCCN 1201?	Self study p 42	As pointed out by the External Review, this is overly <i>ambitious</i> for a program with such low staffing. Upon reflection, it is wiser to address smaller-scale improvements to the program (as noted below). Land based learning is still a very long-term aspiration, but to engage with this goal exceeds the timeline of this program review.
Developing a Work-Integrated-Learning aspect to PCCN	External Review p 7	Some version of hands-on learning would definitely complement PCCN's values and core goals. However, the very thin staffing of the program (currently one faculty ¼ time and two very fractional (1/16 and 1/8 respectively faculty) make initiating and administering such a program too ambitious for us at present.
Expanding PCCN to second year course offerings	Self-study p 55	Current resources and section allocation make this goal unrealistic at this time. We currently have a second year course articulated that we have never been able to offer due to low course section availability.
Addition of one full-time <i>faculty</i> person to the Program	External review p 11	Resources to expand faculty is not likely to materialize at this time.
