Social Service Worker

Program Overview

Langara's <u>Social Services Department</u> offers a <u>Social Service Worker Certificate and a Social Service Worker Diploma</u>, which are pathways into the workplace in as little as nine months, or to transfer to university to complete an undergraduate degree.

The Social Service Worker Certificate Program prepares students for immediate entry into all social service sectors, as well as for further education in Social Work and other helping professions. In addition to a Social Service Worker Certificate, students can also complete a Coordinated Social Service Worker Diploma by adding 30 Arts and Sciences credits to the Certificate.
